a curriculum for excellence

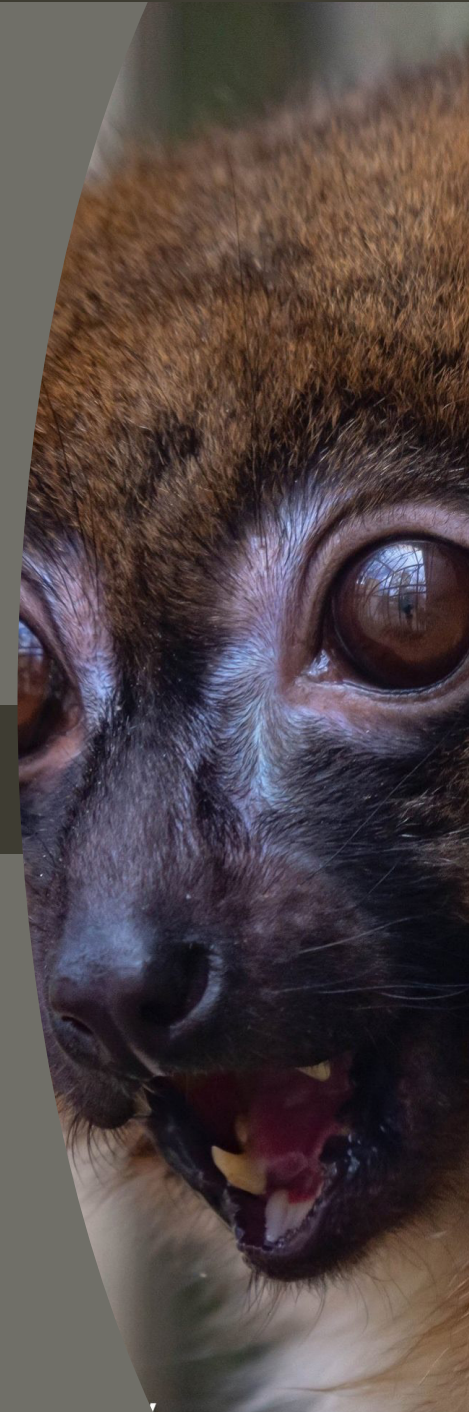

health & safety

A generic risk assessment for school visits is available on request for teacher guidance, but please bear in mind that specific hazards will vary from time to time.

• paths

Whilst mainly tarmac, they may still be uneven. Grass lawns may be slippery.

• weather

Most areas of Camperdown Wildlife Centre are open to the elements.

• vehicles

Some motorized transport may be in operation on paths.

• clothing

Please dress for the prevailing weather conditions and for walking.

• animals

Most of our animals are housed in their own enclosures and some of these enclosures are further protected with barriers. These enclosures and barriers must not be crossed. Free ranging animals must not be approached or harassed.

• toilets

Public toilets are available on site including disabled access.

• first aid

Entrance staff members are trained in First Aid. Any staff member can obtain assistance for you if required, or direct you to the main Entrance Building.

• lost children

The Entrance Building is the main point of contact for reporting and re-uniting missing children. Many staff are in radio contact with each other and can assist within the grounds.

• hygiene

Animal droppings might be present in publicly accessible areas. Hand-washing is available in the public toilets. There are also hand-washing facilities in the Learning Room for use during or after class lessons.

• allergies

We have a wide variety of cultivated plants and 'wild' areas of long grass, please be aware of the allergies of your individual students and avoid areas that may be harmful.
